

Core CANINE Vaccines and Treatments:

Rabies: It is legally required that all cats and dogs be vaccinated against rabies as it can be transmitted to humans. We will provide you with a Rabies tag and Certificate upon vaccination.

Distemper/Parvo vaccine: The DA2PP vaccination protects dogs against distemper virus, parvovirus, canine adenovirus types 1 and 2, and parainfluenza virus. According to the American Animal Hospital Association, it is critical that every dog be vaccinated against these deadly diseases.

Pyrantel Deworming: treats intestinal roundworms, hookworms, and stomach worms in dogs and cats.

Depending on your pet's lifestyle you may also choose to get:

Bordetella/ Adenovirus/Parainfluenza: Commonly called the kennel cough vaccine, this intranasal vaccine protects against 3 common agents that can cause upper respiratory diseases in dogs. We recommend it is given to dogs who socialize with other dogs, such as at the dog park. It is also required by most boarding or grooming facilities.

Leptospirosis Vaccine: this canine vaccine protects from a potentially deadly bacteria that is spread through livestock and wildlife into water sources. Dogs are exposed to the bacteria when drinking from ponds, rivers, puddles, irrigation ditches, or even when exposed to small rodents. Recommended especially for dogs that participate in various outdoor activities such as going to parks, hiking, etc.

Core FELINE Vaccines and Treatments:

Rabies: It is legally required that all cats and dogs be vaccinated against rabies as it can be transmitted to humans. We will provide you with a Rabies tag and Certificate upon vaccination.

Feline Combo vaccines: FVRCP vaccine is considered to be essential for all cats by the American Association of Feline Practitioners. It prevents three potentially deadly airborne viruses: rhinotracheitis (feline herpes), calicivirus and panleukopenia.

Pyrantel Deworming: treats intestinal roundworms, hookworms, and stomach worms in dogs and cats.

You may also choose to microchip your pet:

Microchipping: A small chip the size of a grain of rice will be implanted between your pet's shoulder blades and will contain a specific code to help you reunite with your pet if they are lost. We recommend this as it helps us get pets back to their owners quickly if they end up at the shelter.
